June also brings a special event that everyone can enjoy 2018 ARRL Field Day! This year ARRL Field Day is on June 23rd & 24th so make your plans to attend now. The Jefferson County Amateur Radio Club will operate from our clubhouse located a 923 Boston Ave in Nederland. Set up starts at 8:00AM on Saturday, June 23rd. The radio operations run from 1:00PM (1800 UTC) Saturday to 1:00PM (1800 UTC) Sunday. That's 24hrs straight on the air. Are you ready? Can you make it 24hrs? We will be operating under the club callsign W5SSV. We have come up with a pretty good antenna system that minimizes interference between stations but we are still evaluating some new antennas to throw in the mix. This year our Educational Activity will be on the new MFJ Cobweb Antenna. How to assemble it, how does work and how is it different that a hex beam antenna.

There will be VE Testing after lunch for new applicants or upgrades. This will be the last test session before the Technician question pool changes on July 1, 2018.

The main thing is to come out and have a good time and get on the air. There will be new faces, old faces, tall tales, remembering the good old days, remembering our silent keys, some new radio equipment to operate and just spending time with good friends. It doesn't get much better than that.
